

Our Savior Lutheran Church was established in 1945 by a small band of faithful Christians who gathered together in what was then the far northwest edge of the city of Houston, rapidly growing as World War II drew to its conclusion. The goal of our forefathers was to establish a congregation whose programs would reflect the full gamut of the biblically defined ministries of a Christian church.
